TREASURER'S REPORT

Stephen Booth had done an analysis of potential income and possible reductions in income.

There were options and initiatives to help us. No rent rebate from UU. Burnley council will give a rate reduction to save £340. Nothing from the insurers as they are denying responsibility.

There is a grant of £10000 from Burnley Council because we are a community sport club and will be used to offset shortages in income from fall in membership numbers and extraordinary costs in re-opening the club and its facilities. ie safety boats and other pieces of equipment.

The council is considering a reduction in fees for full year paid up members in 2021.

There was much discussion about how to reimburse club members for loss of facilities this year and after very careful consideration it was decided on the course of action below.

Only members having paid the full year membership for 2020 (which excludes those joining after July on reduced fees) will be considered for any reduction in membership if the club is in a position to offer them. Our thanks go out to those members who are supporting the club in this difficult time.
