# Treasurer's Report.

S Booth reported that October was a heavy month for expenses. At the end of October there was £24,932 in the current account, £6023 in the reserve account and£3083 in the 100 club. There was a notification to renew the power provider and S Booth recommended that we stay with the current provider who had given us favourable terms.

M Lewis asked a question about the Balance Sheet as to why it didn't balance?

S Booth didn't have all the answers so a meeting was arranged. M Lewis and S Booth would investigate the balance sheet and report back to Council.

## Membership Report.

Ste Gratton the new membership secretary reported that he was finding everything a bit of a mystery but going forward he has some ideas. He could send an annual statement to every member and they could arrange bank transfers. There was discussion about how to collect members' subs and it was decided that G Whalley, S Booth, and S Gratton could get together to sort the problem. S Booth explained some of the workings and said it would take a little time to master everything but it would be achievable. There was nothing else to report but S Booth and M Morgan had helped with 2 late members and it was hoped that after Lockdown they could get together and have a proper meeting.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT.

N Platt began with a Vote of Thanks for the Commodore's work in the past year. He then went on to mention that 6 months ago he had brought to the attention of the council the fact that matters were getting more and more complicated. A lot of Council functions could be restricted to only certain members. He also produced a list of meeting dates for 2021 and an AGM date which didn't clash with Remembrance Sunday. S Booth would help in arranging the Secretary's e mail address then everything could be streamlined. N Platt also urged

## **COMMODORE'S REPORT**

M Girven informed the members that the Club was closed for another month and we were doing everything possible within Government restrictions. He had sent an email to all Council members about opportunities from Sport England but hadn't had any replies from anyone. M Lewis mentioned that £3,500 may be possible from Burnley Borough Council and that it may overcome any membership reduction next year. M Girven asked for someone to check the Sport England grants especially for getting youth into new sports. He has also sent out a calendar for 2021 for event dates to be posted on. This will help to give members hope for a near normal 2021 and if they are on the Calendar, it is up to Council to make them work. D Hudson the vice Commodore endorsed these comments.

#### Council roles.

**D** Hudson is taking on the role of Vice Commodore but as the season moves forward it may be possible to appoint someone new. R Glowa will head Fleet, Norah and Mike Morgan will lead Estate duties, Adam and Mick will head race duties. Chris Ball and M Lewis will organise social events.

Mike Morgan then produced a budget report but no definite actions resulted from much discussion.

Ste Gratton asked for information on SUPs and Inflatable Kayaks but they were for existing members only. The idea was to give members opportunity to get on the water in the absence of wind. The RYA is looking at additional opportunities to get people on the water to give potential for long term memberships.

Tom Nimmo reiterated his concerns laid out at the AGM and these would be looked at. An onsite meeting would be arranged between himself, D Hudson and M Girven as soon as Government restrictions allowed.

He also pointed out that not everything that was discussed was minuted. M Girven pointed out that they were always a correct record and passed by all members.
